Once again our students have achieved exceptional GCSE results with 82% of students achieving five or more GCSE grades A*-C. This is down to the hard work and dedication of staff and students alike.

We are constantly reviewing all aspects of school life to help maintain good results for all our students. We are therefore introducing a new element to our behaviour policy which is designed to minimise low level disruption in the classroom.

This approach to classroom discipline is called the 3Cs, which stands for Chance, Choice and Consequence

Chance

If any student is being disruptive in class they will be informed by the teacher that they are being given a chance to modify their behaviour.

Choice

If the student's behaviour continues to be disruptive the teacher will inform them that they now have the choice of modifying their behaviour or receiving a consequence for continued disruptive behaviour.

Consequence

If the student's behaviour still does not improve the consequence will be a 10 minute meeting with the class teacher at break or lunch to discuss their actions, how it affects the class and how they can avoid further disruptive behaviour.

Failure to attend this meeting will lead to a 20 minute lunch detention. If the student does not attend this 20 minute detention their Form Tutor will place them in after school detention.

We also take pride in the appearance of all our students and we will be monitoring the appropriate wearing of the school uniform. Any student who is persistently not conforming to the uniform policy will be placed in after school detention by their Form Tutor.
